News Article: The Evidence Base for Scribes and the Disruptions of COVID-19

Many physicians work a considerable amount of unpaid overtime. Without a scribe, once a shift has ended, physicians often complete charts and this time isn't usually captured in administrative databases. Many studies note that physicians go home soon after completion of their shift when working with a scribe but can't report the magnitude of the effect. One study illustrated decreased documentation time both during and after shift with scribes, but was limited by size and power.

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
